

YUKON *WILDLIFE ACT* regulation change process

I've got a regulation change to propose.

Now what?

What happens next?



DRAFTING & IMPLEMENTATION

Minister of Environment responds to Board within 30 days.

Proposals are **ACCEPTED, VARIED, SET ASIDE, or REPLACED.**

If a proposal is accepted, **new legislation is drafted** and goes through multi-level review within Yukon Government.

Minister of Environment **brings draft legislation to Cabinet.**

If Cabinet approves, **legislation is implemented.** Target date April 1 annually.

JANUARY:
YFWMB makes final recommendations to the Minister of Environment.

DECEMBER BOARD MEETING:
YFWMB develops recommendations on proposed regulation changes, based on public review and "What We Heard" document.

APRIL 30:
Proposal deadline for submission to **YFWMB** (Yukon Fish & Wildlife Management Board).

MAY – AUGUST:
YFWMB works with proponents to confirm final version of proposals before public review process.

AUGUST 30:
Director of Fish & Wildlife approves by signature proposals submitted by EY (Environment Yukon).

INFORMATION gathering

INFORMATION verification

public REVIEW

AUGUST – SEPTEMBER:
Proposal Review Committee (members from YFWMB & EY) prepares briefing report based for full Board review.

OCTOBER BOARD MEETING:
YFWMB (full Board) review briefing report, identifying proposals going for public review.

NOVEMBER:
YFWMB prepares "What We Heard" document, **with support from EY.**

OCTOBER-NOVEMBER:
YFWMB advertises public review and survey, hosts and facilitates Whitehorse meeting, and works with RRCs in communities. All comments received are recorded.
