

## Adaptive Provisions in effect for 2020/2021 – (April 1, 2020)

This table outlines adaptive Wildlife Regulation provisions currently in effect through Ministerial determinations. Adaptive provisions enable responsive determinations for the number of harvest opportunities, the timing of harvest and/or the areas where opportunities are available. These provisions were enacted in accordance with accepted recommendations from the Board or a Council or another advisory body or through implementation of management plan or planning process recommendation.

The determinations outlined below are intended to provide clarity in areas where regulations are qualified through Ministerial determinations. This table does not include species, numbers, areas or dates where regulations have not been established to enable adaptive approaches to management.
